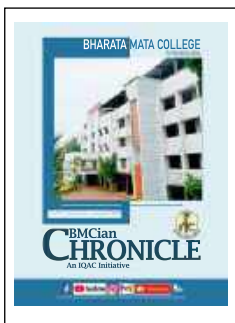

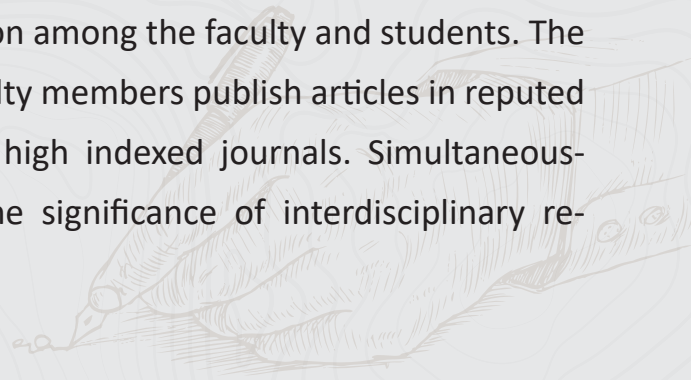
Message

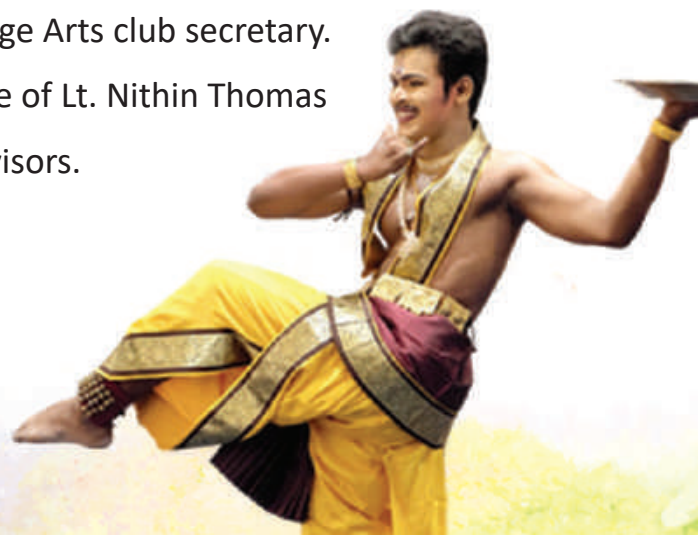


ARTS DAY *Navarang 2.0*

International Conference

The Postgraduate Department of English, Bharata Mata College conducted a two days international conference on 'The Limits of Liberalism: Polity, Literature and Beyond' in collaboration with M.G. University and PRAJNA Foundation on the fourth and fifth of January. The topic which was of significant contemporary relevance was analysed from various perspectives by eminent scholars like Prof. Akeel Bilgrami, Prof. Prabhat Patnaik, Prof. Sanil, and Dr. Silpa Satheesh. The conference attracted valuable paper presentations from 60 participants which were conducted in four offline and six online sessions.

The first day of the conference had two plenary sessions by Prof. Akeel Bilgrami and Prof. Prabhat Patnaik. Prof. Bilgrami's enlightening talk on 'Gandhi and Liberal Modernity' in the forenoon session (10-11:30 am) was followed by paper presentations. The afternoon session (1:30- 3:30) was enriched with Prof. Patnaik's talk on 'The Economic Theoretical Underpinnings of Liberalism'. It was followed by paper presentations. Online paper presentations were conducted in parallel sessions.

The second day consisted of three plenary sessions. Prof. V Sanil talked on the question 'Does Fascism Think?' in the first session. The second session was on 'Neoliberalism and the Environment: Understanding the Interface Between Labour and Nature' which was deliberated in-depth by Dr. Shilpa Satheesh. The final session of the second day was Prof. Akeel Bilgrami's talk on 'Aesthetic Experience: Is Truth A Goal of Humanistic Inquiry'. It was followed by paper presentations. Each session was engaged by pertinent questions and debates which made the conference an important turn in the journey of academic inquiries.



International Conference on Materials Science

**Organized By Post Graduate And Research Departments Of Chemistry And Physics
On 9th & 10th January 2023**

In Collaboration With Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam

The International Conference on Materials Science jointly organized by the Postgraduate and Research Departments of Chemistry and Physics, Bharata Mata College, Thrikkakara was held on 9th and 10th January 2023 at the BIMM Seminar Hall of Bharata Mata College. Dr. Anu K John and Dr. Shibi Thomas from the Departments of Chemistry and Physics respectively were the coordinators of this conference.

This conference was aimed to bring together the academicians, scientists, technologist and experts to share their knowledge on recent developments and advances in Materials Science. This provided a platform for undergraduate and postgraduate students, research scholars, faculty and scientists to refine their knowledge and share their ideas and to broaden their horizon. This conference discussed current research trends and future research directions in Material Science. The conference featured thematically-arranged invited lectures by eminent faculty from top Universities in the areas such as Material Science, Nanotechnology, Energy harvesting and storage etc.

The inaugural session of the conference commenced with the blessings of God almighty with a prayer song by Ms. Swathy of I BSc Chemistry. Dr. Sindhu Joseph, Head, Department of chemistry & Research Dean welcomed the gathering. Dr. K. M. Johnson, Principal, Bharata Mata College delivered the presidential address. Dr. Suresh C. Pillai, Director, Health and Biomedical Centre, & Head of Nanotechnology and Bio-Engineering Research Group, Atlantic Technological University, Sligo, Ireland inaugurated the conference. Ms. Lissy Kachappilly, Vice



Principal felicitated the gathering. Conference Convenor Dr. Shibi Thomas delivered the vote of thanks for the inaugural session.

The scientific sessions of Day 1 began at 10.00 AM with the technical session of Dr. Praveen C. S, Asst. Professor, International School of Photonics, CUSAT on the topic “Bridging the gap between theory and experiments”- The synergetic way of thinking. The session was chaired by Dr. Sindhu Joseph, Research Dean and HoD, Department of Chemistry.

The Session 2 was started at 12.00 PM after the inaugural meeting. The session included the keynote address of Dr. Suresh C. Pillai, Director, Health & Bio-Medical (HEAL) Centre & Head of Nanotechnology & Bio-Engineering Research Group, Atlantic Technological University, ATU Sligo, Ireland on the topic, “Nanotechnology for Energy and Environmental Applications”. This session was chaired by Prof. Dr. Shiny Palatty, Former Principal, Bharata Mata College, Thrikkakara.

The Session 3 was again handed by Dr. Suresh C. Pillai on “Connecting Research, Technology and Innovation” which was followed by the interaction of the keynote speaker with the faculty and the students and it was a dynamical session.

On the 2nd day of the Conference, there were two technical sessions and oral/poster presentations. The first technical session was by Dr. Ajith R. Mallia, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry SB College Changanassery addressed the topic “Organic Semiconducting Materials for Solar Light Harvesting”. Dr. Manesh Michael, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics chaired the session. The second session was handled by Dr. M Mayarani, DST INSPIRE faculty, Department of Physics, IIT Palakkad on the topic, “Soft Matter: Matter that Matters a lot!”. Dr. Jinsa Mary Jacob, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry has chaired the session.

The technical sessions were followed by oral and poster presentations. About 16 papers were presented during the oral presentation and 6 posters were also presented. Prof. Jessy George, Retired Faculty, Department of Physics and Dr. Litty Sebastian, Assistant professor, Department of Chemistry evaluated the presentations/posters. Mr. Praveen P, Research Scholar, International School of Photonics, CUSAT got first prize in oral presentation and Ms. Meenu Eldose, Research Scholar, Department of Chemistry, Newman college Thodupuzha got first prize in poster presentation.

During the valedictory session, the prizes were distributed and some of the participants shared their feedback about the conference. Conference convenor Dr. Anu K John, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry proposed the vote of thanks. Around 400 participants which includes faculty members, students and research scholars from our college and various institutions were benefitted from the conference. Certificates were issued for all the registered participants.

International Workshop on Variants of Graph Domination (IWVGD – 2022)

The Department of Mathematics, Bharata Mata College Thrikkakara (BMCT) organized a three day International Workshop on Variants of Graph Domination (IWVGD) 2022 co-sponsored by Kerala State Council for Science Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) from November 17th to 19th, 2022. The workshop served as a good platform to introduce the concept of Domination in graphs to upcoming researchers, with main focus on some variants of Graph Domination such as Power Domination, Roman Domination and Secure Domination. It also helped in creating a collaboration network of researchers in Domination Theory and its applications.



The workshop was convened by Dr. Seethu Varghese, Asst. Prof and Head, Department of Mathematics, BMCT. The advisory committee consisted of Prof. Andreas M Hinz, Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität-München, Munich, Germany, Prof. Ambat Vijayakumar, Emeritus Professor, Department of Mathematics, CUSAT, Dr. Manoj Changat, Professor and Head, Department of Future Studies, Kerala University, Dr. Indulal G, Professor, Department of Mathematics, St. Aloysius College, Edathua and Dr. Tamizh Chelvam T, Emeritus Scientist, Manormaniam Sundaranar University, Tamil Nadu.

The workshop was inaugurated on 17th November 2022 by Mr. S. Vasudevan, Scientist G, Director (Science and Technology), NPOL, DRDO. The Principal of the college, Dr. K.M. Johnson presided over the function. Dr. Seethu Varghese, Department of Mathematics welcomed the gathering and Prof. Ambat Vijayakumar, Emeritus Professor, CUSAT, Dr. Sindhu Joseph, Research Dean and Dr. Ajay Joseph, IQAC

Coordinator offered felicitations.

The workshop included 13 invited lectures by National and International experts in this field. International speakers included Prof. Leslie Hogben (Associate Dean for Graduate Studies and Faculty Development, Iowa State University, Ames, US), Prof. Glenn H Hurlbert (Virginia Common Wealth University, Virginia, US) and Prof. Paul Dorbec (University of Caen Normandy, France). Their sessions were streamed online at the venue. The National speakers who handled the offline sessions were Dr. Ambat Vijayakumar (Emeritus Professor, Department of Mathematics, CUSAT), Dr. Seema Varghese (Associate Professor, Department of Mathematics, Govt. Engineering College, Thrissur), Dr. Manju K Menon (Associate Professor & Head, Department of Mathematics, St. Paul's College, Kalamassery), Dr. Aparna Lakshmanan S (Associate Professor, Department of Mathematics, CUSAT), Dr. Tijo James (Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics, Pavanatma College, Murickassery) and Dr. Seethu Varghese (Assistant Professor & Head, Department of Mathematics, Bharata Mata College, Thrikkakara). The workshop also included problem solving sessions and session by the participants to discuss their research problems.

The program concluded on 19th November, 2022. Prof Michel Waldschmidt, Sorbonne Universite, Institut Mathematique de Jussieu, France was the guest of honour for the valedictory function. He also gave a talk on 'The square root of 2, the Golden Ratio and the Fibonacci sequence'. The Manager of the College, Rev. Fr. Abraham Oliapurath presided over the valedictory function. Prof. Ambat Vijayakumar offered felicitations. The program concluded with a vote of thanks by the convener of the workshop, Dr. Seethu Varghese.

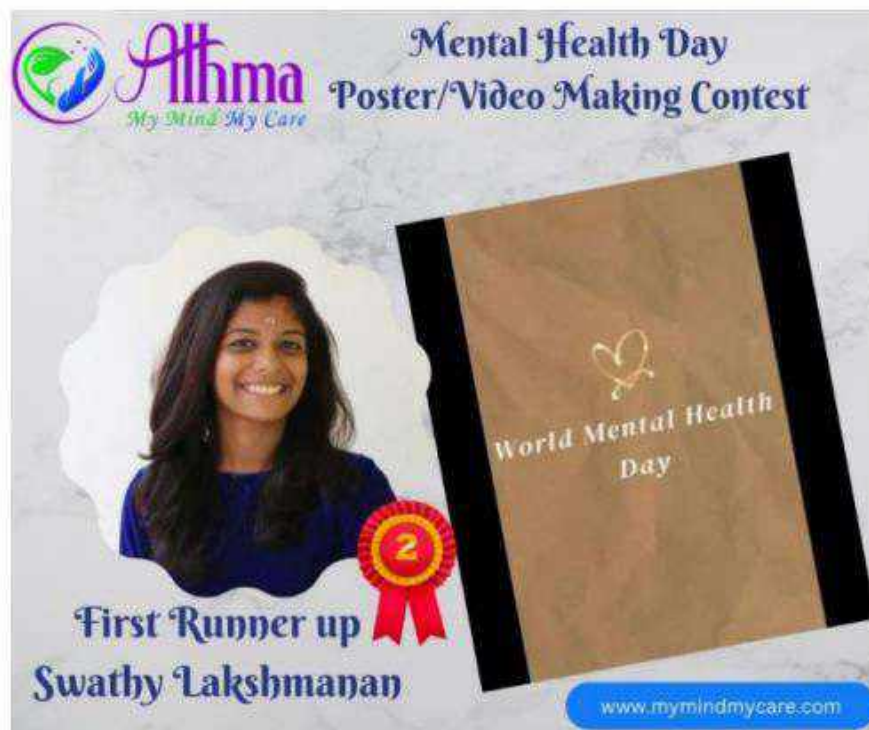

A group of students from Bharata Mata School of Social Work trainees had the opportunity to support Daya Bai and those who have been affected by Endosulfan Disaster. The social worker trainee reached the secretariat by 10:40 am. As part of the activities, the students performed flash mobs, street plays, and folk songs together. Two street play was performed in order to highlight the need for an AIIMS in Kasargod District . In addition, it depicts the hardships and sufferings faced by Endosulfan victims and their families. In addition, the students performed flash mobs to attract the public's attention to the strike , in turn which was taken by the media and show cased in many different ways like promoting party based and all which was later clarified by the college authority and told them that there isn't any party side but would stand with Daya Bai for a noble cause. . Students also performed folk songs appropriate to the context that is by not wasting much time the tarinees worked on the flashmob more than 3 times so that each new people passing by and also present over there would get an idea and also gets attracted by the performance. Even new generation people would get awareness through such street plays and also folk songs. . Prof. Tony M. Tom led the team. The students also got attention from media channels. The students, too, were appreciated by the former Kerala Chief Minister Sree Oommen Chandy for their commitment and social responsibility towards the problems in society.

The strike started for a noble cause for the People who all are living in Kasaragod district affected with endosulfan and also for not getting into such trauma for the other sections of concerned citizens. People living in more than 20 gram panchayats in Kasaragod district were exposed to the highly toxic endosul-



fan. And it causes destruction in the district and neighbouring regions of Karnataka. It poisoned more than 6,000 people. People living in this time are facing difficulties by birth with congenital disabilities, hydrocephalus, diseases of the nervous system, epilepsy, cerebral palsy, and severe physical and mental disabilities. This problem is considered as the biggest pesticide tragedy in India. Daya Bai, an Indian social activist from Kerala, working among the tribals of central India. She is now engaged in the issue of endosulfan victims. She has been working for their rights for a few years now. She protests and she stands for the welfare of endosulfan victims.

Daya Bai has been on a hunger strike since October 2 in front of the secretariat in the capital city of Kerala. She demanded that the Centre should find a solution to the problems of bedridden endosulfan victims in the Kasaragod district. Daya Bai has also demanded that the government set up the proposed AIIMS in Kasaragod district.

On Oct 10th 2022, Social work trainees and faculties of Bharata Mata School of Social Work went to Thiruvananthapuram secretariat for supporting Daya Bai and endosulfan victims of Kasargod. Daya Bai is fighting for endosulfan victims through hunger strike. The social work trainees, were given an opportunity to perform a street play in front of a big crowd. The play addressed the need for an AIIMS and super speciality hospitals to be built in Kasargod district. This was the first opportunity for the students to perform their street play, flash mob and folk song in front of a huge gathering.

Street play conducted by 1st year Social Work trainees of Bharata Mata School of Social Work performed flash mob and street play in front of large crowd at Secretariat, emphasizing on endosulfan issues. Trainees performed 1 flash mob and 2 street play on manifesting their situa-



tions. Through this program the trainees improved their interaction towards the community, their skills of acting and the support of trainees were very much strengthened for them. This Program was initiated on supporting Daya bai, in order to provide medical facilities at AIIMS for their better livelihood. Many of them were isolated on receiving better treatments, they deserves to be treated like others, which is being denied and their health is also important as others so that's the purpose of the program that have been initiated.

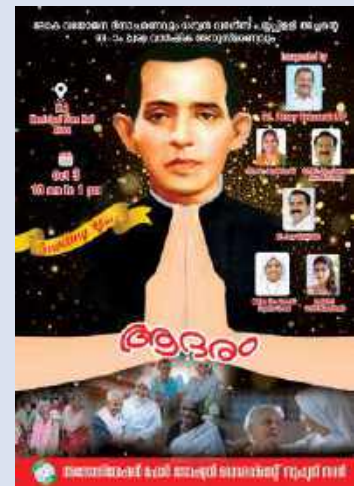

Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) is a methodology used for interactive processes of social development: It is a way of learning from people, with the people and by the people. It is, therefore, a methodology for analyses, planning, monitoring and evaluation. It focuses on the stimulation of participation by local people. Specific techniques are used to encourage greater involvement among people and to enable them to take the leading role in appraising conditions and identifying solutions.

PRA Tools that social work trainee learnt are: Resource mapping: Resource map in PRA is done not by experts, but by the local people. The local people are considered to have an in-depth knowledge for the surroundings .Where they have survived for a long time. Hence the resource map drawn by the local people is considered to be accurate and detailed. It is important to keep in mind, however, that it reflects the people's perception rather than precise measurements to scale. Thus, a resource map reflects how people view their own locality in terms of natural resources.

Problem tree: The problem tree has three parts: a trunk, roots, and branches. The trunk is the main problem. The roots represent the causes of the core problem while the branches represent its effects.

Transect walk : The Transect walk reveals the location and distribution of resources, infrastructure, social interaction, landscape, land use patterns and different activities taking place within a community or targeted area. Transect walks are a participatory exercise, where planners walk through different areas of the neighbourhood, interviewing passers-by and drawing a map with observations of characteristics, risks and existing solutions after the walk.

Pair wise ranking : It helps to priorities the problems and needs of the people. It is a tool that can uncover the most important problems of the community. It is a structured method for ranking a list of items



in priority order.

Daily routine analysis: The method is used to document the activities and the timing of activities and to compare the differences between schedules. This can be done with an individual or a group.

Venn diagram or Chapati diagram: It shows institutions, organisations, groups and important individuals found in the village, as well as the villagers view of their importance in the community.

Day 1: 22/11/2022,

Introduction to PRA tools were taken by Fr. Willson. Fr. Saji shared his life experience in Bihar. And a doubt clearance session was given by Fr. Varghese about buffer zone and major problems in Idukki.

At day 2: 23/11/2022, the session was held by Fr. Willson on PRA tools and it's applications. He taught pair wise ranking method, problem tree, seasonal diagram, daily routine analysis. Social work trainees were divided into a group of 10 members. Each group had to make seasonal calendar of Kerala, Resource mapping of BMC, social work trainees were sent to field to observe the daily routine and also to find the common problems of the local peoples for preparing problem tree. The social work trainees combined with local peoples of Marygiri done Venn diagram, resource mapping, problem tree. And the day ended with cultural programs.

At day 3: 24/11/2022, the day start with an interaction session with children. Each group had presented their reports. And the day concluded by vote of thanks, by Jesla, Aswin & Elsa ma'am.
