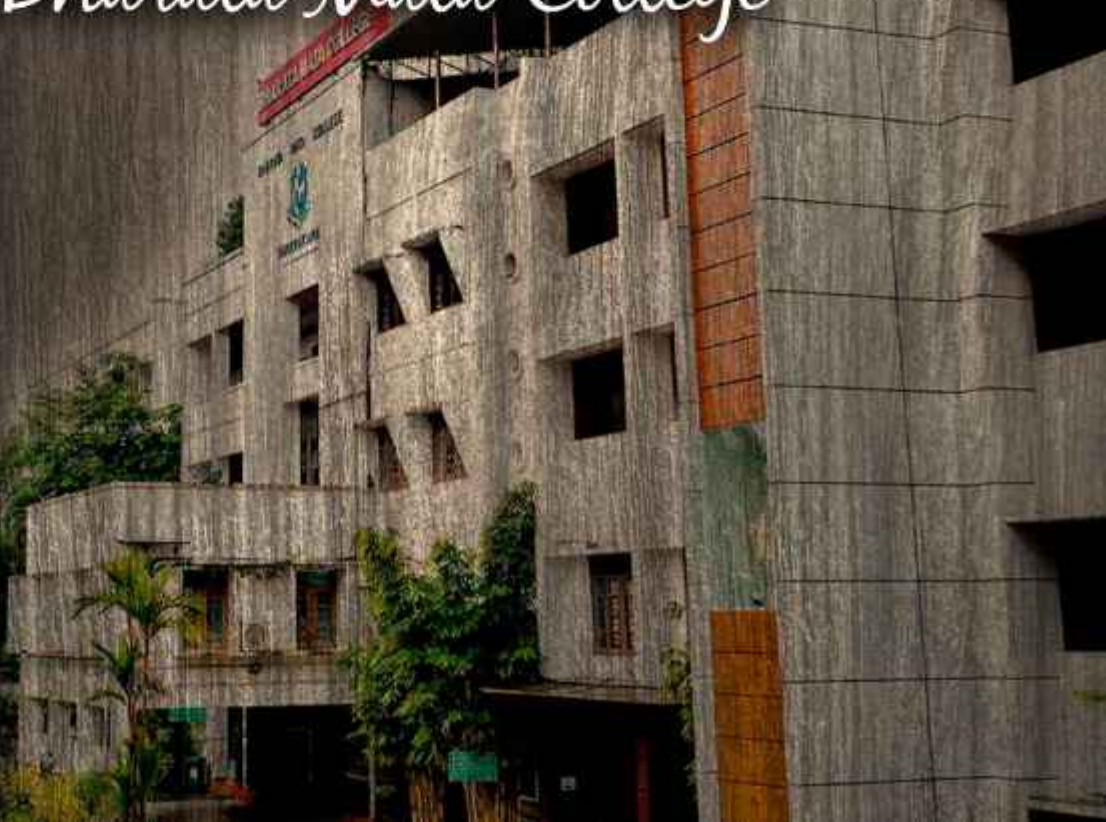

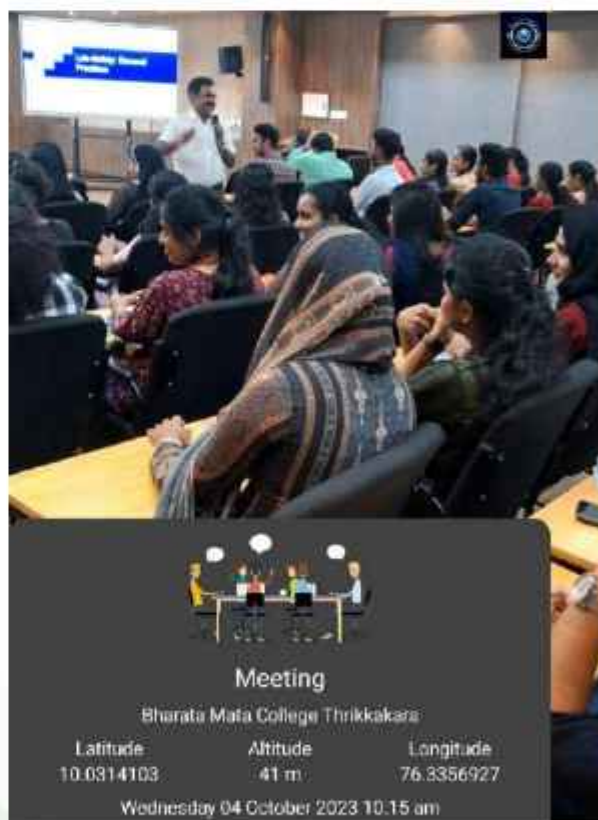

He explained the theory of accidents by the safety triangle proposed by Herbert Heinrich. He cleared the doubts raised by students and faculty members on handling certain chemicals and guided the faculty members and laboratory staffs on safe disposal of laboratory chemicals which can avoid the surrounding pollution.

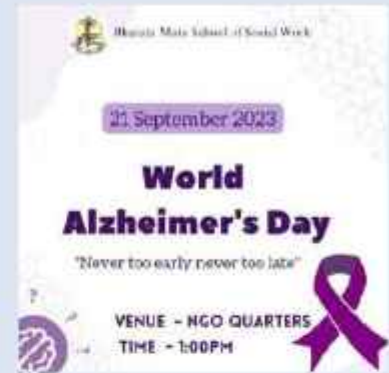

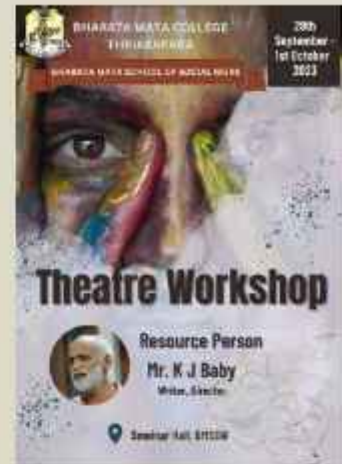

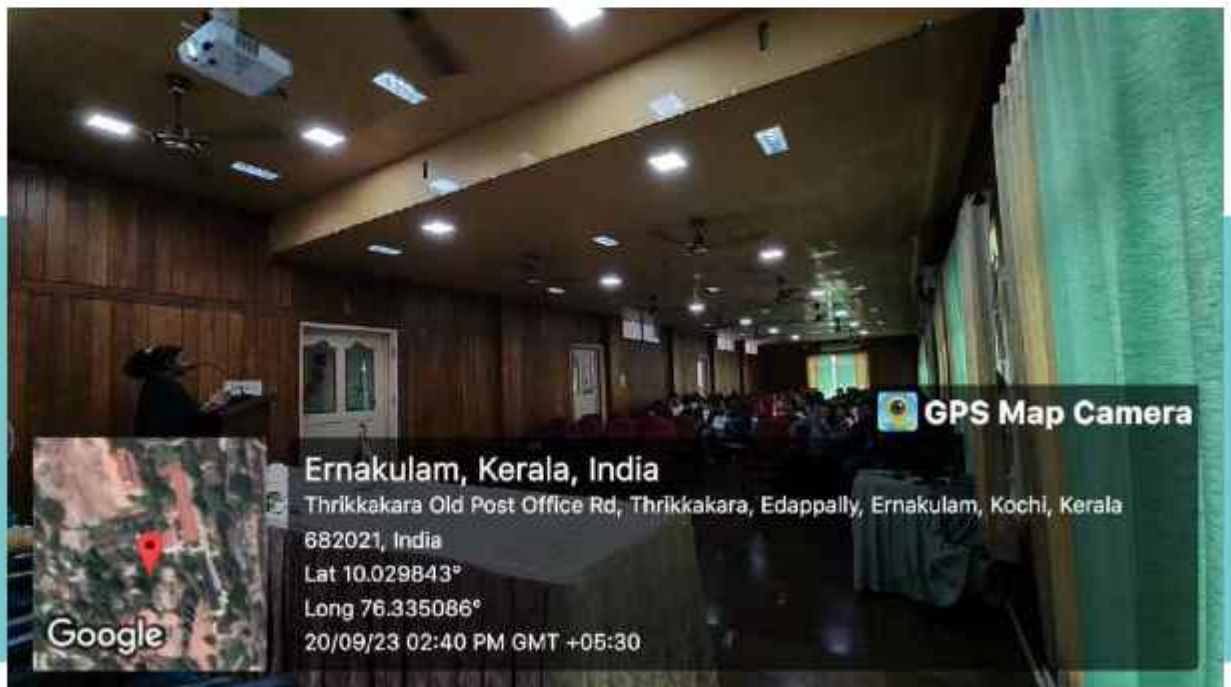

Following the formal session, lunch was served, and in the afternoon, several talented students took the stage, showcasing their skills through captivating songs and dances.

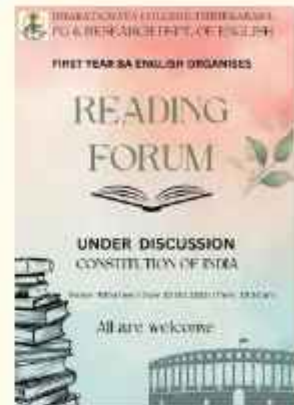

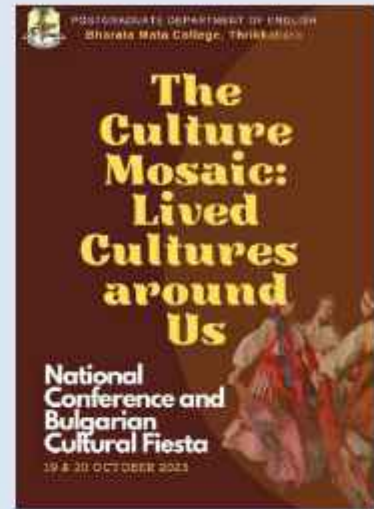

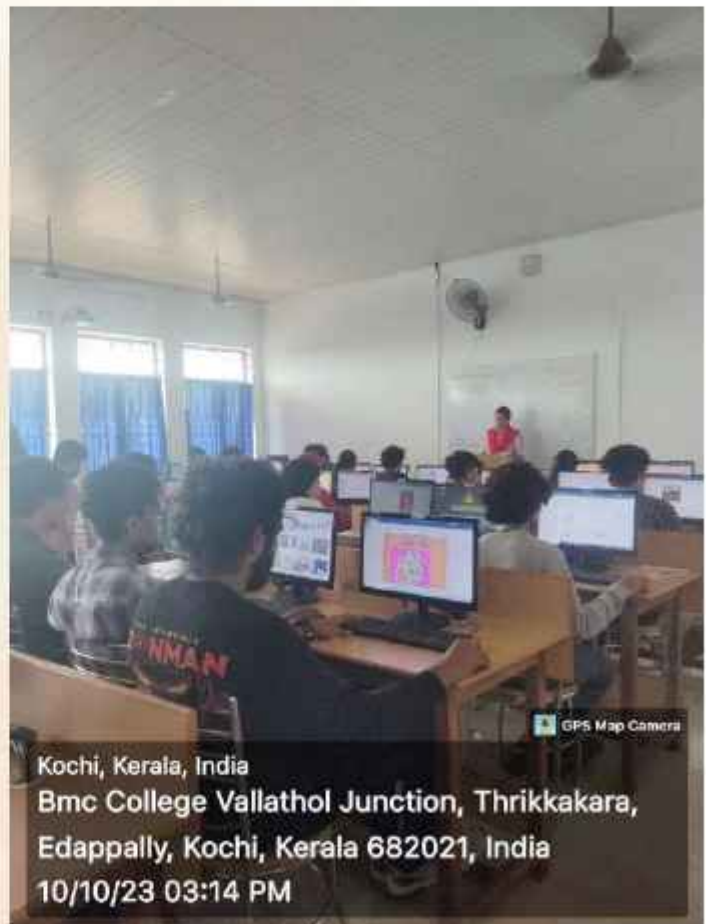

The talk also addressed the philosophical and psychological angst prevalent among the teenagers in their current formative years which in turn paves way to their rebellious meddling with drugs. The program was found to be exceptionally effective in inspiring the first-year students to make better choices in life, and improve their opportunities in both their professional and personal lives.

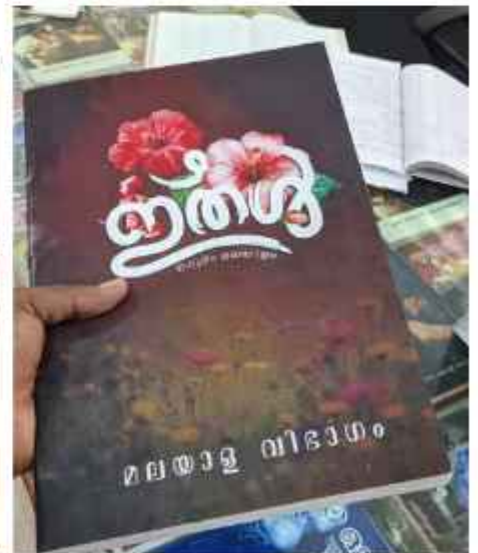
