## Department at a Glance

The Department started functioning in the founding year of the college, on 16 June 1965 with five pre-degree batches. It was conferred the official status of the Department of English when the degree course in English commenced on 28 July 1970 with a sanctioned strength of 24 students. Rev. Dr. C. A. Abraham was the first Head of the Department. On 17 October 2013, the department was upgraded to the status of the Post Graduate Department of English with the commencement of the Masters Programme in English Language and Literature. The course is intended to introduce the students to understand and interpret human society, to appreciate language and literature, and to establish connections across frontiers of disciplines. The students become competent to critically engage with culture, gender and marginality and become acquainted with modes of narration and representation. They are also encouraged to become potent and effective teachers, writers, and knowledge generators in the field.

There was an introductory talk by Dr. Laly Mathew, former HoD English. She gave the students a complete lecture about the poem and how wasteland became the symbol of modernist writings. The speaker explained why the work was initially criticized and mocked, but how it later came to be widely recognised as a classic. It was followed by an exciting intra-departmental quiz. The major attraction of the event was an installation of the poem. In this session the students came up with an installation of the poem's postmodern setting and the dramatic performance in the form of an interactive theatre.

## Asan-Bharati Commemorative Symposium: Celebrating the Two Mahakavis of the South

The Post Graduate Department of English, Bharata Mata College, in collaboration with the Tamil Cultural Research Centre, Palakkad and The Ernakulam Tamil Sangam hosted a symposium to celebrate the two Mahakavis of the South, Kumaranasan and Subramania Bharati. Hon.Chief Justice, High Court of Kerala, Sri. S. Manikumar awarded the accolades to Sri. Rajeev Alunkal(poet and lyricist) and Sri. Vanavil K Ravi (Tamil and English poet). Prof. Dr. Raja Ram (Tamil Cultural Research Centre, Palakkad) and Mr. Basheer (Ernakulam Tamil Sangam) were present. Chief Justice Sri.S Manikumar delivered the inaugural address. The grandson of Mahakavi Kumaranasan, Prof. Arun Kumar and the grandson of Vallathol Narayana Menon, Mr. Ravindran also took part in the symposium. The organizing committee included Rev. Fr. ## Distinguished Lecture Series

The department organized two distinguished lecture series in the month of October.

- Dr. Saugudha Badhuri, Professor Centre of Language Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi talked about the "Issues in Popular Culture" on 19 October 2022.
- Dr Dileep Kumar Das, Professor, English and Foreign Languages University, Hyder abad talked about the "Interdisciplinarity of Cultural Studies" on 23 October 2022 at 10 am.

Post Graduate Department of English, Bharata Mata College conducted an international webinar "The Spatial Situation: Place, Orientation and Mapping in collaboration with the Prajna Foundation on April 4, 2023. The keynote speaker, Prof. Robert Tally, is a Professor of English and an Honorary Professor of International Studies at Texas State University. His research and teaching focuses on the relations between space, narrative, and representation. He is active in the emerging scholarly fields of geocriticism, literary geography, and spatial humanities. Prof. Tally is also the general editor of "Geocriticism and Spatial Literary Studies." He explored the nuances of spatial representation in the narrative which demands the incorporation of the logic of the situation in order to emphasize on the fundamental meaningfulness of the place and thereby help to lend a broader sense of place in our various spatiotemporal situations and frames of reference. The webinar has turned out to be successful in facilitating scholarly discussions in connection with spatial cognition, meaningfulness of place in narratives and the spatial relationship that we share with the world around us. A participation of more than 100 scholars from different parts of India has also contributed to the success of the event.

# Two-day International Seminar 'The Limits of Liberalism: Polity, Literature and Beyond'

The Postgraduate Department of English, Bharata Mata College conducted a two-day international conference on 'The Limits of Liberalism: Polity, Literature and Beyond' in collaboration with the M.G. University and the PRAJNA Foundation on the 4, 5 January 2023. The topic which was of significant contemporary relevance was analysed from various perspectives by eminent scholars like Prof. Akeel Bilgrami, Prof. Prabhat Patnaik, Prof. Sanil, and Dr. Silpa Satheesh. The conference attracted valuable paper presentations from 60 participants which were conducted in four offline and six online sessions.

The first day of the conference had two plenary sessions by Prof. Akeel Bilgrami and Prof. Prabhat Patnaik. Prof. Bilgrami's enlightening talk on 'Gandhi and Liberal Modernity' in the forenoon session (10-11:30 am) was followed by paper presentations. The afternoon session (1:30-3:30) was enriched with Prof. Patnaik's talk on 'The Economic Theoretical Underpinnings of Liberalism'. It was followed by paper presentations. Online paper presentations were conducted in parallel sessions.

The second day consisted of three plenary sessions. Prof. V Sanil talked on the question 'Does Fascism Think?' during the first session. The second session was on 'Neoliberalism and the Environment: Understanding the Interface Between Labour and Nature', which was deliberated in depth by Dr. Shilpa Satheesh. The final session of the second day was Prof. Akeel Bilgrami's talk on 'Aesthetic Experience: Is Truth A Goal of Humanistic Inquiry'. It was followed by paper presentations. Each session was engaged by pertinent questions and debates which made the conference an important turn in the journey of academic inquiries.



## Research Orientation Workshop

The PG Department of English, BMC, organized a one-day workshop on 'Research Orientation' on 8 February 2023 in the Audio-Visual Room. The workshop aimed at orienting students to research and to facilitate B.A. and M.A. thesis writing. The resource person for the workshop was Dr. Aravind R. Nair, Assistant Professor in English, Sacred Hearts College, Thevara. He began the session by systematically examining the foundations of research. Later, he sampled individual student projects and helped them identify, assess and analyse research problems. He tried to educate and guide students of III BA, I MA and II MA to consider research as a professional practice. The discussion that followed reflected that the workshop was effective and it gave them the impetus to attempt their project/thesis writing with renewed energy. More importantly, it helped them remove their fear of conceiving an idea and writing about it.



## Extension Activities

# 'Labyrinth': An Interactive Theatrical Adaptation of T. S. Eliot's The Wasteland

The postgraduate Department of Bharata Mata College commemorated the centennial anniversary of the modernist movement and T. S. Eliot's seminal work The Wasteland by adapting the said work into an interactive theatre installation christened as 'Labvrinth'. Labyrinth was the brainchild of the second-year postgraduate student Nevin Manadan and was conceived with the joint effort of the students and faculty of the English department. A prototype of 'Labyrinth' was performed at the college premises on 7 October 2022, in connection with the centenary of T.S. Eliot's Wasteland. The installation was done using minimal properties. The performance was attended by the Manager, Principal, and other dignitaries including the former HoD Laly Mathew. The performance was lauded by the audience. Thus, aspirations to portray this performance in front of a wider audience bloomed. The script was reworked and a meeting was held with Alex Thomas John from Sacred Heart College, Theyara and Ruchika Dhillon from the Biennale Foundation on 16 March 2023. On 19 March 2023, a new setting design was proposed by Athira Manoharan (Guest Faculty) and a scenic director was assigned to each scene. The scenic directors were:- Adarsh, Athma, Megha, Dilhara, Adithya, Hisham, Maiza, Vrinda, Dikhil, and Athul. The cast was selected through auditions. Two meetings(one with the cast and another with the crew) were held on March 20, 2023. The faculty in-charges - Athira Manoharan, Saran Punnekadan and Maria Sharol Cherian attended the meetings. Training for the actors started on March 21, 2023. The training sessions were held at BA II classroom from 3:30 to 5:00 and at Radio garden from 5:00 to 5:30. The actors were - Chandik, Amos, Merin, Angel, Augustine, Tiya, Ann Varghese, Chris, Mithun, Archana Anil, Anna James, and Christy. All the actors were students from the department. The actor training sessions continued in this pattern till March 28 2023. From 29 March 2023, full-day practice sessions were held at BOSA hall. It continued till 31 March 2023.

On 22 March, 2023, Staff representative Athira Manoharan along with students Nadia and Dilhara visited the installation site which was Dhobi Khana in Fort Kochi. The measurements of the space was taken and the space was booked through Rekha PV, the president of Dhobi Khana's Welfare association - Vannar Sangham. On 28th March, The

name for the installation was decided(Labyrinth) and the performance date was fixed on 1st April from 2:00PM to 6:00 PM. These details were communicated to the Biennale Foundation thorugh Ruchika Dhillon.

On 30 March 2023 the Kochi-Muziris Biennale's official instagram handle shared the news of the performance. On 31st March, representing the department, guest faculty Athira Manoharan and Saran Punnekadan conducted a Press Conference at Press Club, Ernakulam and gave a brief overview about the performance. The director, Nevin Manadan was also invited for an interview by Radio Mango where he described his installation. The faculty incharges and students visited the place on the same day and started setting up the space for the performance. The students involved include Keerthana, Akshay, Fathima, Anjana, Anagha KS, Jovin, Anagha NM, Christo, Fayaz, Anagha TM, Shone Franklin, Aditya, Lakshmi, Soney, Joel Babu, Sowndarya, Zahal, Navneet, Pranav, Ajai, and Gurumahima. It was supervised by Sreelakshmi Pazhoor, Saran Punnekadan, Maria Sharol Cherian, Sanjoe P Davis, Domnic Baby, Athira Manoharan, Nadia and Alex.

On 1 April 2023 the installation was performed at Dhobi Khana, Veli, Fort Kochi. The screening was held from 2:00PM to 6:30PM. It was visited by many dignitaries, faculty and other art aficionados.

Prominent newspapers like Mathrubhumi, Manorama, Deepika, Janayugam, Desabhimani, Janmabhumi published the reports of the event on the next day. News channels like 24 and Manorama also reported the event and it was shared on their social media handles as well. An amount of 3000 ₹ was paid towards Dhobi Khana's Welfare association - Vannar Sangham for remuneration and allotment of space.

#### Mentoring Report

The students of UG and PG of the department were allotted as mentees to the regular faculty of the department.

The mentors met and first discussed the basic details of the mentees, noting down the salient details. Next, their dreams and ambitions were discussed. It was found some students were very clear and focused about their aims. Others needed to be brought on track to identify their paths. After discussions, the mentors gave them suitable advice.

There were some instances of truancy which came up during discussions but the students were found to be overburdened due to the conduct of multiple pending exams along with their regular semester exams.

Several students with mild behavioral issues were reported to the counselor. They have shown marked improvement.

One student was found to have major behavioural issues and the counselor along with the class teacher and HOD advised immediate medical consultation.

Over the months the student has shown distinct improvement and is more regular in class. All the mentees have met the mentors at least twice though attention was focused on the students who needed more attention.

The mentoring process has been recorded in the mentoring diaries provided by IQAC.

# Add-On / Certificate courses (2022 23)

The Department of English at Bharata Mata College signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Atmamitra, Kalady, to conduct an Add-on course for first-year students. The course, on Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP), began in October 2022 and aimed to introduce students to various topics related to NLP, such as Memory learning, Memory Anchor, Self-Anchoring, Life History Log writing, Re-living Commands, NLP Model of Communication, and Gestalt Therapy, among others.

The classes were activity-based, with students finding maximum engagement in these classes. Specialized activity classes included Sub modalities, Generalisation, Deletion, Distortion, and Presuppositions (visual and kinesthetics'). These activities provided a hands-on experience for the students and helped them understand the concepts better.

One unique experiment conducted during the course was the Power of Mind. The experiment included activities such as fist opening, fireball swallowing, Pencil Breaking, and Wheel of Life. These activities aimed to amplify the beneficial effects of NLP on the mind.

On Saturday, 7th January 2023, the students had a one-day session at Atmamitra Centre in Kalady. The session was designed to cater to the topics of SBM healing, SBM boosting, exploring bad memories, and sweet revenge. The focus then shifted to the idea of the Power of Mind and subsequently towards Communication and Circle inversion exercises.

The session on SBM healing aimed to introduce students to the concept of Self Belief Management (SBM) and how it can help them heal and overcome obstacles in their lives. The session on SBM boosting aimed to provide students with tools and techniques to enhance their self-belief and improve their overall well-being. The session on exploring bad memories aimed to help students deal with negative experiences and memories in a healthy and productive manner. The session on sweet revenge aimed to introduce students to the idea of channelling their anger and frustration toward positive outcomes.

The session on the Power of Mind included activities such as visualizing success and overcoming obstacles, affirmations, and visualization exercises. These activities aimed to help students understand the power of their minds and how they can use it to achieve their goals.

The session on Communication aimed to provide students with tools and techniques to improve their communication skills. The exercises included role-plays, active listening, and non-verbal communication exercises. These activities aimed to help students improve their interpersonal skills and communicate effectively in various settings.

The session on Circle inversion exercises aimed to help students overcome their fears and limitations. The exercises included standing on the edge of a circle and facing their fears, and walking towards them. These exercises aimed to help students overcome their mental barriers and achieve their goals.

In conclusion, the Add-on course on Neuro-Linguistic Programming conducted by the Department of English at Bharata Mata College in collaboration with Atmamitra, Kalady, proved to be an engaging and informative course for first-year students. The activity-based classes, specialized activity classes, and unique experiments such as the Power of Mind helped students understand the concepts better and provided them with tools and techniques to improve their overall well-being. The one-day session at Atmamitra Centre in Kalady provided students with a holistic experience and introduced them to various topics related to NLP. The session on SBM healing, SBM boosting, exploring bad memories, and sweet revenge, along with the focus on the Power of Mind, Communication, and Circle inversion exercises, helped students develop their interpersonal skills, overcome their fears and limitations, and achieve their goals

The department initiated the centenary celebrations of T.S. Eliot's unparalleled modern classic "The Wasteland". The students imbibed the spirit of The Wasteland as it is a brilliant portrayal of the post-WWI Europe that was "a heap of broken images".

There was an introductory talk by Dr.Laly Mathew, former HoD English. She gave the students a complete lecture about the poem and how wasteland became the symbol of modernist writings. Why it was greatly criticized and mocked, but still how it was widely recognised in the modern as society now. It was followed by an exciting intra-departmental quiz. The major attraction of the event was an installation of the poem. In this session the students came up with an installation of the poem's postmodern setting and the dramatic performance in the form of an interactive theatre.

#### READING FORUM

The Reading Forum is a collective initiated by the first year B.A. English students in order to impart the habit of reading among themselves. The Forum selects three works for every session: one from English literature, one from Malayalam, and one from non-fiction. The idea is to meet together informally, discuss these works and share the joy of reading.

The first session of the Reading Forum met under the Ritu Tree on campus on 18 November 2022. The books under discussion were Oru Sankeerthanam Pole by Perumbadavam, Sapiens by Yuval Noah Harari, and The Catcher in the Rye by J.D. Salinger. Each member of the forum shared their viewpoints on the works over tea and

snacks. The second session of the Forum met on 18 January 2023 to discuss the following works: Pathummayude Aadu by Basheer, The God of Small Things by Arundhati Roy and The Annihilation of Caste by B.R. Ambedkar. The students came with notes prepared on the works and presented their viewpoints. The gathering dispered after shortlisting the books for the next session.

#### QUILT MAKING

In connection with Women's Day, the students of the Postgraduate Department of English made a quilt on 8 March 8 2023, inspired from The Color Purple by Alice Walker, a text prescribed in VI semester Women's Writing course. The ingenuity, dedication and the co-operation among the students paved way to the quilt, which is a symbol of hope, irrespective of caste, gender and sex.
